## ***Wood End Infant School – Code of Conduct for Behaviour***

It is a primary aim of our school that every member of the school community feels valued and respected and that each person is treated fairly. We are a caring community, whose values are built on mutual trust and respect for all people, living things and property. We aim to promote an environment where everyone feels happy, safe and secure. The school behaviour policy is therefore designed to support the way in which all members of the school can live and learn together.

The aim of the behaviour policy is to teach children to become positive, responsible and increasingly independent members of the school community and is designed to promote good behaviour, developing our ethos of kindness and co-operation.

Our rights respecting values are:

1. I have the right to be safe.
2. I have the right to be an individual.
3. I have the right to be healthy.
4. I have the right to come to school and learn.
5. I have the right to say what I think and be listened to.

Our values have been written so that they are easy to understand and recalled by children, parents and staff. They apply to all children, whether they are in nursery or infants.

In conjunction with these values, each classroom displays their 'Class Charter' which is drawn up in agreement and signed by all class members. The children try very hard to follow the charter to enable a happy, peaceful, purposeful environment where learning is enjoyed.
