




**In Maths we will be continuing to develop our number knowledge.**

You can use the coins more than once.




I can add 3 1-digit numbers



Use ten frames and counters to add the numbers

## Who was Mary Seacole?

Mary Seacole was a **businesswoman and nurse**.

She came from **Jamaica**.

She **travelled** to many places, including Panama, London and Turkey.


She spent her entire life trying to **help sick and injured people**.

We remember her because she was incredibly **brave**.

She **risked her own life to help others**.

<b>Childhood</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mary was <b>born in 1805</b> in Jamaica.</li> <li>Her father was a Scottish soldier</li> <li>Her mother was a Jamaican nurse and healer.</li> <li>She <b>learnt lots about medicine and nursing</b> from her mother.</li> </ul>
<b>Travels</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mary visited nearby islands in the Caribbean, where she bought spices pickles and jams to sell back at home.</li> <li>She also visited England twice!</li> </ul>
<b>The Crimean War</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In 1853, lots of soldiers were suffering in a <b>war in Turkey</b>.</li> <li>Mary offered to help but <b>was told she wasn't needed</b>.</li> <li>She went anyway, <b>using her own money to pay for a ship</b>.</li> </ul>
<b>The British Hotel</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In the Crimea she opened the '<b>British Hotel</b>'</li> <li>She <b>cared for sick and wounded soldiers</b>.</li> <li>She even rode <b>on horseback into the battlefields</b> to care for soldiers on both sides, which was incredibly <b>dangerous</b>.</li> </ul>
<b>After the War</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>After the war Mary went back to London.</li> <li>She had <b>no money</b> and was not well.</li> <li>Many soldiers who had been looked after by Mary raised <b>money for her</b></li> <li>She received <b>medals for bravery</b>.</li> </ul>

<b>Location</b>	<p>Jamaica is in the <b>Caribbean</b>, off <b>North America</b>.</p>	<p>Jamaica is an <b>island</b>.</p>
<b>Weather</b>	<p>It has a <b>tropical</b> climate, so the weather is <b>hot</b> all year. There is a <b>rainy season</b>.</p>	<p>Sometimes there are <b>hurricanes</b>.</p>
<b>Food</b>	<p>Lots of tropical fruits like <b>pineapples, bananas</b> and <b>passion fruits</b> grow there.</p>	<p><b>Jerk chicken, rice and peas</b> and <b>fried plantains</b> are popular foods.</p>
<b>Famous People</b>	<p><b>Ussain Bolt</b> is the fastest 100m runner in the world.</p>	<p>Jamaica is famous for <b>reggae music</b>. <b>Bob Marley</b> was a very famous reggae singer.</p>
