Home Learning Agreement

We believe that children learn best when parents, the school and children work together in partnership. Home learning helps children to consolidate and reinforce their school learning; this includes their skills and understanding in Maths, English and other areas of the curriculum and helps raise the level of individual's achievement.

Home learning will be:

- Differentiated and should be undertaken to the best of the child's ability.
- A mixture of written and practical activities including games, talk homework and research.
- Given to children every Friday in a folder.
- Returned to school by the following Tuesday.

Consists of:

- Nursery - Every holiday the children are given a task which has a talking about/understanding of community and family focus. Daily reading is encouraged.
- Reception) – Maths, Handwriting, Spellings and Weekend News. Daily reading recorded in reading records and word cards
- KS1 (year 1 and 2) – daily reading (recorded in reading record book and signed by an adult), one piece of English & Maths and a set of spellings which will be tested weekly.
- In addition all children may be given topic based activities.

Ways in which parents can support children's learning at home:

- Establish a home learning routine.
- Provide a quiet learning environment.
- Go through home learning before your child starts and discuss the completed work when finished.
- Hear them read every day including during the school holidays.
- Give them help and encouragement.
- Get involved and above all talk to them about their learning and listen to what they tell you.
- Take them to museums and libraries and other educational places of interest.
- If you have access to the Internet, there are many websites that can help your child explore the subjects they are learning at school.
